WHY DO WE SPEND SO MUCH MONEY ON A FREE RESOURCE?

- Globally we spend \$100 billion a year on bottled water¹
- The U.S. uses **50 billion** water bottles a year²

HOW MUCH DO WE PAY FOR WATER IN CALIFORNIA?

- Bottled water: Approximately \$1 per gallon*
- Tap water: 1 cent per gallon³

Tap water is 100 times less expensive

than bottled water!

 * Based on the 4/3/15 price of a 2.5 gallon bottle of Arrowhead 100% mountain spring water priced at \$2.98 at <code>walmart.com</code>

IS BOTTLED WATER SAFER THAN TAP WATER?

- Bottled water plants test for bacteria once a week⁴
- Tap water must be tested 100 or more times a month⁴
- Bacteria grows in warm, moist environments, like unrefrigerated water bottles⁵
- Studies show that chemicals used to make plastic bottles can leach into the water over time⁶

Therefore NO, bottled water is not always safer than tap water.

DOESN'T BOTTLED WATER COME FROM CRYSTAL CLEAR LAKES?

 25% to 45% of bottled water sold in stores is simply bottled tap water⁷

BUT AT LEAST WE RECYCLE PLASTIC WATER BOTTLES, RIGHT?

- 75% of empty water bottles end up in landfills, lakes, streams, and oceans⁸
- Transporting and keeping bottles cold uses fossil fuels, contributing to climate change
- In one year 50 million barrels of oil are needed to produce and transport water bottles; equivalent to oil needed for 1.5 million cars per year⁸
- Plastic water bottles can take thousands of years to decompose⁹

Recycling is not enough to counter the damage caused to people and ecosystems.



Water bottles that end up in lakes become dangerous to the wildlife.



WHAT CAN YOU DO?

1. Buy and use a refillable water bottle. Learn about different types of bottles at <u>http://bit.ly/ZPw2TX</u>

2. Ask your water supplier for a water quality report. Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) customers can visit their website at <u>http://ladwp.com</u>

- 3. Consider buying an inexpensive water filter for your home
- 4. Refrigerate water and/or cut slices of fruit into water for a refreshing drink
